**Leadership Training Camp, Feb., 2021**

**INTRODUCTION:**

A Leadership training camp was organized by the Department of Physical Education, RGU, from 14th February to 19th February, 2021 at Yubbi Village (30 km from RGU), located near the Hoj circle of Papumpare District, AP; a perfect topographical landscape for camping and hiking.

The leadership training camp was organized as a part of biennial program under the curriculum of the Bachelor of Physical Education. The Vice chancellor, RGU and the HOD, Physical Education were the chief patrons of the camp. The camp was organized under the directorship of Dr. Anil Mili and Program Director Dr. K. Rojeet Singh. **OBJECTIVES:**

The main objective of the camp was to provide a platform to unite, trust and task oriented among the students. ## DAY 1

### 15th February

The girl campers arrived at the camp site in the morning around 10 am led by Dr. Sambhu Prasad, Director Outdoor Activities. Before lunch, one group was introduced

The events of flag snatching competition were conducted separately for both boys and girls.

To make the leadership camp more interesting, everyday there was campfire in the evening. There were competitions held during the campfire between the four groups. On the second day of the campfire, the program started with the introduction of the fresher's. It was followed



by cultural program which included some dance competitions, singing and some chit

chatting. The night concluded with a good dinner. Some of the students helped in serving the meals. After the light off; the member of the assigned group had done the night duty.

## Day2
