## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Under '*EK Bharat Shrestha Bharat*' scheme of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, Rajiv Gandhi University, Doimukh, Arunachal Pradesh organized a Dialogue on '*Dekho Apna Desh*' in collaboration with Aligarh Muslim University (AMU), Aligarh and Banaras Hindu University (BHU), Varanasi. Dr. Sambhu Prasad, Nodal Officer, EBSB, RGU while welcoming all the members briefed about the programme and outlined the objectives of the programme is to promote the uniqueness of India as a '*nation*', which is woven by diverse linguistic, cultural and religious threads, and held together into a composite national identity by the rich history of cultural evolutions. The program showcased the History, Tangible and Intangible Heritage, Foods, Arts, Craft etc. of Arunachal Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh as well.

*Prof. Saket Kushwaha*, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of Rajiv Gandhi University in his speech laid the importance of getting to know each other very well. He said, during this pandemic time, the role of the teachers is very important and we should motivate our students, colleague teachers as well as common citizens to come out of this common fear and add it to our humble duties. He further stressed on starting **KYC** or '**Know Your Country**' as a part of school syllabus, right from class 1 to 12 and that should include information of various states comprising of their unique cultures, food habits, languages and lifestyles. He also added that North East Part of India has much more to offer to that in the form of many intangible heritages; like folklores are abundant in the region. He also

called on to bring upon a mechanism in which we can make our younger generations through knowledge sharing so that they can be united as one.

Speaking on the occasion the Vice-Chancellor of BHU, *Prof. Rakesh Bhatnagar* reminded to the participations that Bharat is a great country with many provinces with many languages and food styles and lifestyles. He highlighted the greatness of the old civilization that India had and which had given place and space to everyone those who came here, making it the ideal place for unity in diversity. Taking examples of the *Parsis* and *Jews* people who had come to this country as businessmen but got settled here itself. He added the country has embraced everyone with open arms despite of religious and other differences.

The Speaker of the Program *Prof. Shambhunath Tiwari*, Dept. of Hindi, AMU elaborated the existence of culture with the quotes "*loss of Culture is loss of Identity*". He focuses on the beauty of culture and tradition in every state and also added that Arunachal is a very resourceful state with awesome languages and many researches are going on that. He further added that Arunachal: the place where the sun rises first in the morning, is no more a far away from main land.

The Second Speaker *Dr. Pravin Singh Rana* of the Tourism Management Department of BHU gave a presentation on the topic '**Focusing tourism in eastern UP**'. He beautifully explained the huge tourism potential of the area. He highlighted places like Agra which is famous for its Taj Mahal, Mathura, Vrindavan, Baranas, Lucknow, Ayodhya and Jhansi and many more. He demonstrated the uniqueness of Banarani Sarees, Lucknow's Chikankari and Mathura's Sanjhi art and various tourist circuits like; the heritage, wildlife, and craft circuits among others that enhances the tourism potential of the region.

*Prof. Tariq Mansoor*, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University in his speech proudly recalled the unique beauty of our country and called it unparalleled to anywhere in the world. He also said that every place in the country is unique and we should not compare among those places. Each of the places has its unique characteristics, cultural heritage and natural surroundings. Prof. Mansoor added that due to this pandemic, hospitably and tourism industries were given a hammer blow. He added that

how we talk about our country and the beautiful places like the J&K, Kerela and the North East it have. He also expressed the need of bringing a tourism friendly environment in the country.

*Prof. Sumpam Tangjang*, Dean, Student's Welfare, Rajiv Gandhi University, in his deliberation gave a nice description of Arunachal Pradesh, its journey from NEFA days to the present. He gave a brief outline that how this land is inhibited by many tribal's with their unique languages, who celebrate different festivals, worship many Gods and Goddess. He invited one and all present in the programme to pay a visit to Arunachal Pradesh, which is home to many species of orchids, natural parks and a uniquely poised biodiversity.

*Prof. M. K. Singh*, Dean of Students, BHU also expressed his feelings in very short and crisp words about the culture and diversity of our country.

The **Chief Guest** of the programme, *Shri Nakam Nalo, Hon'ble Minister of Tourism, Transport and Civil Aviation, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh* in his speech welcomed everyone to visit and experience Arunachal Pradesh. He personally requested the Vice Chancellors of BHU as well as AMU to come here and have a taste of the natural beauty of the state. He expressed that the state shares international borders with China, Bhutan, and Myanmar and is the largest in term of geographical area in the northeast and added that one won't know about Arunachal unless one visit to. He affirmed, unless we know each other, the mighty goal of *Ek Bharat* cannot be achieved.

*Prof. S. Sirajuddin Ajmali*, Nodal officer, EBSB, AMU in his brief remarks outlined the literary legacy of Uttar Pradesh that ranges from Urdu to Hindi languages.

*Prof. V. N. Tripathi* Nodal officer, EBSB, BHU concluded the programme with vote of thanks. Joint Coordinators of RGU and AMU, *Dr. Rajeev Ranjan Prasad* and *Dr. Araman Rasol Faridi* also attended the programme.
